## U. of T.'s Will Rogers Fund.

WILL ROGERS would like the idea of having his name given to a state university fund for scholarships for needy and deserving young men and women. Nothing in the form of a memorial better illustrates the character of the late humorist-philosopher with the rare knack of compelling listeners to laugh and think simultaneously.

Three States enjoy the privilege of turning his name to such account. Oklahoma has it because it was his birthplace. California is included because he had made his home there during the later years of his life. Texas is third because—as was expressed at the ceremony in Austin-"Texas adopted Rogers as much as Rogers adopted Texas." The universities of the three States are so provided by the fund as to guarantee many scholarships where they are deserved. The system is one which will grow with the generations. Those so fortunate as to enjoy it have the obligation of keeping it intact in principal and increased by interest. It is inconceivable that a beneficiary will ever break the continuity chain by not replacing the portion used.

To have been educated by way of the Will Rogers Fund will be the pride of many a future owner of a "name."
