About a year ago, I made arrangements with Miss Electra Waggoner, a well known Sculptress, of New York and formerly of Fort Worth, to make a bronze equestrian of sweet old Will Rogers, which has recently been completed.

Miss Waggoner went to California and spent about ten days with Jimmy Rogers on his ranch near Santa Barbara, where she used "Soap Suds" as the model and had the help and assistance of Jimmy using Will's own saddle and equipment. There are only four of these bronze equestrians of Will - one of which I am sending to Betty Rogers, one to Eddie Cantor, one for myself and the other I am having sent direct to the Will Rogers Memorial in Claremore with my compliments.

Miss Waggoner is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Waggoner of Fort Worth and Vernon and a granddaughter of the late W. T. Waggoner, cattle and oil king of Texas. She has done a number of outstanding pieces including a bust of Vice-President Garner and many other notables and distinguished people. Frankly, I like the model she has done of Will on "Soap Suds" better than anything I have seen. Mrs. Rogers and the family also like it very much and I hope that it meets with your approval.
