As you know the statue is here and erected but covered with a tarpaulin awaiting its dedication which will have to be postponed until a little later due to the war situation and conditions. All of this Mr. Carter will write you in detail as soon as possible.

Meanwhile, someone gave him a "Will Rogers" cigar which seems to be a very cheap cigar and Mr. Carter wondered if you knew anything about it and that someone was promoting the cigar. If they are going to name a cigar after Mr. Rogers, Mr. Carter feels it should be the best obtainable. It is manufactured by W. H. Snyder & Company. A sample is being sent under separate cover.
