 The Cabinet, upon recommendation of the Curriculum Committee, passed favorably upon the following at its meeting Thursday afternoon:

"That the degree of Bachelor of Education be omitted and the student who would pursue that curriculum be given the A. B. degree, provided that those who choose to major in Education must have 24 hours in one academic subject and 18 hours in another."



"On the basis of a suggestion from the Fine Arts group, we recommend the inauguration of a course in Orientation in the Fine Arts (or Appreciation of Fine Arts), open as elective for sophomores, juniors, or seniors, in 3 semester hours; followed by another 3 semester hours course; designed chiefly for non-Fine Arts students."

The candidate for the A. B. degree with a major in music may present a total of 60 hours in music instead of 42 hours as previously.
