Actions at Cabinet, March 22, 1934

1. A new course:

History 14, English History, 6 s. h., restricted to Freshmen, primarily for pre-law students, open to B. B. A. students.

2. That, Sociology 145, Anthropology, be dropped back to 132, the course to be known as Introduction to Anthropology and to be offered alternately with a new course, Sociology 136, to be known as Culture Growth, for which Introduction to Anthropology would be advised as a prerequisite.

3. A new course:

Phil. 130, Advanced Logic, 3 s. h.

4. That Math 12 be changed in nature so as to emphasize the application of mathematics to statistics, social sciences, business administration, etc. and Math. 117 be eliminated.

5. That Math 13 be changed to an 8 s. h. course and Math 125 be eliminated, and that

6. No grade discount be given a Freshman who takes 17 hours where the work is required in the normal curriculum.

7. Voted that for the present we retain the present set-up of required subjects.

8. That English be a minor with a Foreign Language major.
