- 2. To be retained in class you should have in hand a white card for every student. Grades were turned in on several students at mid-senester for whom the teachers did not have white cards.
- 3. When a student has been absent as many as three consecutive recitations be sure to report same to this office so that we make inquirey about reason for absence.

.The Business Office sends out notices to teachers asking that some student be dismissed from class to go to the Business Office. This is done only in extreme cases, hence it is very important. Teachers will, of course be thoughtful and render this assistance.
