May 19 the Cabinet voted:

POLICY CONCERNING ABSENCES
FROM CLASS.

Credit and grade in a course are to be determined primarily on the student's mastery of the contents and attainment set for the course, as measured by (1) preparation of class work, (2) class tests, (3) final examinations, and (4) initiative and diligence. Regular class attendance is required of Freshmen and Sophomores and in Freshman and Sophomore classes. Several absences will tend to lower the grade; frequent or persistent absence will preclude a passing grade.

Class attendance is expected of Juniors and Senior classes, subject to special arrangement with the teachers in case of special assignments for students with high grade such as on the "honors" plan.

There is no provision for doing the work of any course as a non-resident student.

CABINET ACTION ON "PREVIOUS EXAMS"

The standing rule concerning final exams is that no exams may be given ahead of the schedule, but that the student who misses may take it later by paying a fee.

Exceptions:

1. In small classes composed of seniors or nearly so the teacher may include the entire class early with the seniors.
2. The students who go officially to the Hollister Conference. These names will be furnished soon.
3. On May 17, the Cabinet voted: A student's petition for an early exam as an exception to the rule may be granted by the Dean and Registrar if in their judgement the circumstances warrant; subject to the consent of the teacher.
