The December issue of "Readers Digest" contains the following definition-"Traffic Light: A little green light that changes to red as your car approaches."

May we suggest a similar definition -

"Faculty Bulletin: " little "read" sheet that should change the "green", but apparently doesn't - (from what we have seen.

Here's the point we're after. Early in the school year and then not long ago several essential routine items regarding "White cards", "drops", and other items of record were included in this "little read" Faculty Bulletin. Some have heeded and we thank them most heartily. Others may also help greatly by observing the following "Traffic signals" of the Registrar's office.

1. For every student in your class either a "white card" or an "add card" must be in your hand. Mid-semester is too late to discover an unregistered student.

2. Students are to be dropped from your roll only upon official notice from the office. We send the student to you with a rod "drop" card when he expresses a determination to give up the course. You sign the card and note on it the grade the pupil is making at the time and see that it is returned to our office.

3. If a student is absent from your class three consecutive recitations, without a personal report to you giving reason for absence, please notify the Registrar who will in turn report back through the Faculty Bulletin, or, through a personal word, if needed, reason for absence.

4. When a student has dropped your course in the official way please note the drop date on your class book and enter it on your grade sheet when the report is called for.

5. Delay in reporting grades to the Registrar's office brings embarrassment to you, to our office and to our patrons.
