Dear Katrine,

At Mr. Carter's request I have just written him a letter concerning the duplicate casting of the 'Rogers'. Enclosed with it is a letter from Mr. Quattrocchi.

Mr. Carter said that you would take care of all the details and had full knowledge of the proposed casting. I have tried to explain all the necessary angles, as they have been presented to me and I hope that I have made them clear. I am very glad to be of any assistance that I possibly can and if there is anything you wish to know please write me.

My letter of July 19 explained the storage charges but in case it has been lost in the shuffle -- 'In September 1943, you paid \$100.00, this covered trucking and eight months storage at \$10.00 per month. This means that there is approximately \$380.00 storage due, as of the fifteenth of this month'. (That was July, the months of August and September bring the total to \$400, as of the fifteenth of this month).

New York has never been hotter. I have been running around in circles with my daughter home getting ready for school, Electra in East Hampton, and her mother here in N.Y. I do hope you are going to get a bit of a vacation while Mr. Carter is away, although I suppose that is when there is even more responsibility. Your note about the cantaloupe just arrived, thanks ever so much. We return to Texas October 10, hope to see you then.
