we have studied it very closely and with a few
suggestions it is a marvelous likeness. I have known
"Little Jay" all his life so feel that perhaps I
can help.

Mrs. Adams came in and said she had talked with you and you had suggested that we make pencil marks where the changes should be. This we have done and are sending it under separate cover insured parcel post.

There should be a definite lower lip on the left hand side of Jay's mouth as indicated and as you can notice from the picture. Then it is much too heavy above the left eye. Another suggestion is that the crevices in the left ear should be a little deeper or more pronounced. Not being an art critic in any sense, this may be a very poor way to indicate the changes but I am sure you will know a layman's language and after having talked with Mrs. Adams understand what needs to be done and can call these changes to Mrs. Biggs attention.
