A STATEMENT TO THE FACULTY ABOUT PENSION PLANS

The following statement is made to avoid any confusion and to prevent the raising of any false hopes.

A meeting of all teachers and other employees (not students) of T.C.U. is called for 4:00 P.M. Wednesday, May 6th in Main Chapel. Mr. Bert Wilson, of Indianapolis, will present information concerning retirement annuities, based on the vital statistics recently gathered.

Five years ago, the Board discussed the possibility of establishing a retirement fund for the faculty. It fell through because the Board did not feel able financially, and some of the teachers were unwilling to join the plan. Since that time our whole social order has become "pension" conscious in a new way. Recently the Board appointed a Committee to investigate plans and possibilities for united action by Trustees and teachers to enable our teachers to have some dependable means for retirement funds.

That Committee is getting data from several companies including the Teachers Insurance and Annuity (Carnegie) and the Disciples Pension Fund.

The next step of investigation is to ascertain the attitudes of the faculty members. This is a part of the data which the Committee must have to formulate any conclusions. In calling a meeting of the employees of T.C.U., the Administration and the Board assume no obligations and promises no results.

This is an investigation and not a promise. It will be important to have all present, but of course, conflicting engagements will be understood.
