In keeping with Cabinet action and Catalog announcement the examinations for the fall semester will include January 20-27. Two examinations are to be given daily, 8 A.M. and 1 P.M. allowing approximately two hours and thirty minutes for the average student.

Any classes not scheduled may be examined at the discretion of the teacher, provided the examinations come within the week set apart, and provided there is no conflict in hours. Small classes meeting at odd hours should be checked with the Registrar before final examination date is set.
