Summer Term Teachers

In order to conserve time and to fully meet all standards, the summer school classes will include Saturday, June 7, in addition to Thursday and Friday, June 5 and 6. Thereafter the classes will meet five days a week, Monday through Friday, with Saturday omitted.

This plan will give the classes a good start with three consecutive class periods, June 5, 6 and 7, and will insure the teachers ample time during the first term.

Please remember that the regular class period in the summer is an hour and forty minutes for three semester hours each term. Classes offering six semester hours each term, of course will meet for three hours and twenty minutes each day except in the timed classes which are scheduled for the entire forenoon as shown in the catalog.

Please note the following important items:

1. Biology 39 may count as graduate credit in the summer of 1941, provided students carry extra projects.
2. Business Administration 133, scheduled for 9:10 daily during the first term, will be given during the second term instead.
3. History 147, scheduled for 9:10 during the second term, will meet at 7:30 instead.
4. Physics 121 (Photography), scheduled for 10:50 during the first term, will meet at 7:30 instead.

The Reading and Guidance Workshop will be held on the campus with headquarters in Brite College for one week, June 3 to 7. All students taking that course should register at Brite College of the Bible and a representative of the Business Office will be there to collect the \$6.00 fee. Dr. Dougherty is the director and will make adjustments in classrooms where needed.

The T. C. U. Young People's Conference will be held on the campus June 8 to 14. Headquarters for this conference will be Brite College of the Bible and the conference is to be held under the direction of Charles M. Ross, whose telephone number is 4-5985. Any classroom adjustments needed during that week will be made in due time when the necessity arises.
