CONCERNING N.Y.A. WORKERS:

Teachers are reminded that the Government trusts us to see that the students on N.Y.A. jobs make those jobs genuine. Also, we know that it makes for moral flabbiness if the jobs are in any way not genuine, -- merely putting in time.

So each teacher is expected to see that the student actually puts in the time and the work. Do not approve it unless it is so.

Furthermore, there is more work on the campus that needs to be done. Boys are needed for this campus work. Girls should be shifted to boys jobs wherever possible and boys moved to campus. So if any teachers do not have enough work for their N.Y.A. helpers, it is their duty to report this.

IN LAST WEEK'S FACULTY BULLETIN we stated that there were not enough copies of the list showing faculty names, addresses, and telephone numbers to provide one for each member of the faculty. Professor R.A. Smith, Secretary of the Faculty, has given us correct information that there are sufficient copies to go around, so that each member of the faculty may have as many as needed. We are grateful for this correction.

Professor Smith further requests that in the event there is an error in any name, address, or telephone number, the correction should be made through his office at this time that all may have the correct information.

MAY WE AGAIN REQUEST that each teacher follow the class schedule closely. To dismiss your students ahead of time or late is disturbing to other classes. A well-founded complaint has come that some teachers are holding their classes overtime, making the students late to the following classes. Be sure to watch this carefully. Remember the warning bell rings seven minutes before the hour, the dismissal bell five minutes before the hour, and the bell for beginning the class rings on the hour.
