We would go straight to the farm and handle the entire matter without publicity or in any way to suit her pleasure STOP The Junior League of which Mrs. Carter is a Charter member has been anxious to have Mrs. Roosevelt as a guest and when I informed them that the chances were she would only pass through Fort Worth they then asked for the opportunity to send her some flowers from the League STOP I will appreciate it if you will pass this man to this most gracious lady and assure her while we want to do everything for her happiness, pleasure and convenience, at the same time we would be tickled to death to have her.
