

President Roosevelt will arrive in Fort Worth at the Texas & Pacific station June 12th, at 8:30 A.M.

Van Zandt Jarvis, Mayor of Fort Worth, President of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce, as well as President of the Southwestern Exposition & Fat Stock Show, will appoint a reception committee to greet the President.

Official parade will be from the T & P Station, North on Main Street to the Court House across to Houston and South on Houston to Ninth Street; thence on Jennings Avenue out to Rio Grande Avenue, over to South Main Street and to St. Joseph's Infirmary. From there West on Magnolia to All Saints Hospital; South on Eighth Avenue to Park Place and on to Forest Park Blvd; thence on Forest Park Boulevard to University Drive to Texas Christian University, including T.C.U. Stadium. Back through Forest Park to the Rose Garden the most direct route; through Trinity Park to the Fort Worth Frontier Centennial grounds and from there on Camp Bowie Boulevard to Seventh and Houston Streets; thence to Marine Park where the President will speak at an open air meeting at 12:30 noon. From Marine Park to the packing houses and airport, returning to his son's, Elliott Roosevelt, home near Benbrook for luncheon with his immediate family.

This is a tentative itinerary, subject to the approval of Captain Starling of the White House Secret Service Department, who will visit Fort Worth prior to the President's arrival, at which time arrangements will be made with the Police Department for police protection, motorcycle escort, etc.

There will be three open five passenger automobiles. The President and Mrs. Roosevelt, Elliott Roosevelt and his wife, together with Gus Gennerich,

the President's personal attendant, accompanied by Mayor Jarvis will lead the parade. The second car will consist of secret service agents and the third car will contain the Governor of Texas, Jesse Jones and other distinguished guests on the train. Other cars, as many as desire, may accompany the parade.

The Mayor will issue a proclamation declaring a holiday honoring the President of the United States.

Bands - T. C. U. - ROTC and as many bands as can be assembled.

Calvary troop to be at the station to fire customary salute, 21 guns, and accompany parade.
