TOMMY DILLARD to relieve Greene at station, take any other shots necessary and obtain any other arrival pictures available, returning to office immediately after presidential party leaves for Benbrook.

C L RICCHART: At Union Station not later than 9:30 PM for sidelights on crowd awaiting arrival, these sidelights to be 'phoned to city desk. Upon arrival at station, ascertain train schedule, exact time of arrival, calling the office; make sure that REDUS is there to relieve you on arrival story.

BILL POTTS: Report to Union Station not later than 10:30 PM.

Upon arrival of presidential party, contact Bascom Timmons,

Washington correspondent, Senators Connally and Sheppard, and

Governor Allred; ascertain time President will hold press

conference here (this from Timmons), names of prominent persons

aboard train and those boarding train in Oklahoma; any appointments or announcement President may have to make; anything

authentic on rumors of appointment of Governor Allred or others to

federal judgeship.

SUNDAY:

BOB HICKS: General story on how the President spent his day. If

there is a press conference, attend it; contact Marvin McIntyre, the President's secretary, at Fort Worth Club regarding schedule; cover broadcast from the farm. First lead should be cleared for bulldog editions by 5 PM.

RANDOL: Two or three entertainments planned for newspapermen, including ones at Shady Oak and Dutch Branch. Should have good general story on newspaper party, now they spent their time here, also some good pictures.

BESS STEPHENSON: The schedule to be run in box, giving time of President's departure, route he will travel, etc. Separate story on Doris Fleeson of New York Daily News, only woman in newspaper party.

ARRANGEMENTS OUTSIDE FORT WORTH:

PRESSLEY BRYANT will leave Friday night for Amarillo to file first story by 3 PM Saturday, for Sunday morning paper, on Amarillo's preparations; will remain in Amarillo to cover reception there, returning to Fort Worth after presidential party has left Amarillo.

BOB HICKS and D B GREENE will travel on presidential special as far as Wichita Falls, Hicks to cover anything that may develop on the train and a third story on Wichita Falls reception; Greene to make photographs of Wichita Falls reception, returning when the presidential train leaves Wichita Falls, unless otherwise instructed. If Greene should continue beyond Wichita Falls, films taken there should be turned over to Hicks.

BASCOM TIMMONS, Washington correspondent, will continue with the train and cower other points.

JEFFORDS is in Oklahoma City with a portable. Greene will handle portable shots on Roosevelt arrival in Oklahoma City, due here about 7 o'clock Saturday, original prints to be delivered in Oklahoma City

to Timmons by Jeffords, and received at Union Station here from Timmons.

INS also has two photgraphers who will supply photographs, and arrangements have been made in Amarillo for coverage there.
