Dear Lyndon,

I presume you received the copy of the letter from the President, dated June 3, which I asked my office to send you. I enclose a copy of my reply which I thought you might be interested in: I have taken issue with some of the assertions made by the President, I am also sending copies to Senator Connally, Sam Rayburn and Wingate Lucas.

It is my intention to publish this letter and my reply in the Star-Telegram immediately and send copies to all the Senators, even though they may not reach them before the vote on the 'over-ride' of the veto. I realize this will be of very little value in the final out come however I would like the President to know how we feel and incidently how the people of Texas feel in the matter. I feel, frankly, that the President has been grossly mislead regarding the facts in this case. And while our efforts will probably be minor in effect we expect to continue the fight indefinitely.
