

CHICAGO, March 13 (INS).—The ghost of the late Clarence Darrow failed to keep its appointment with Claude D. Noble of Detroit for the eight consecutive year Wednesday. Noble, as he has each year on the date since the great crim-

inal lawyer died March 13, 1938, went to Jackson Park London, knelt on the bridge from which Darrow's ashes were strewn, and holding a photograph of Magician Harry Blackstone toward the sun, recited the Lord's Prayer and intoned: "Clarence Darrow, I am here in fulfillment of our pact. If

you can manifest yourself, do it now." And for the eighth consecutive year, the spirit of Darrow failed to knock the picture from Noble's hand.

Noble waited two minutes, then gave up and said he would try again next year.
