

Copy of telegram to Joe Shea from Goldwyn's West Coast representative regarding shipment of horse to Texas.

At a luncheon given Tuesday by Samuel Goldwyn for Amon Carter and publishers of four Los Angeles newspapers, Harry Chandler, Los Angeles Times; Richard Carrington, Herald-Express; Manchester Boddy, Los Angeles News and Harlan Palmer, Hollywood Citizen-News, Mr. Carter announced he had cut short his recent trip by clipper to the Antipodes and the Orient for the particular purpose of arranging with Mrs. Betty Rogers, widow of Will Rogers, the cowboy humorist, to ship the famous philosopher's horse "Soapsuds" to Fort Worth for participation in the parade to be held in connection with the world premiere of "The Westerner", starring Gary Cooper, Walter Brennan and Doris Davenport.

In retirement since the passing of Rogers the horse will make his first appearance in five years when Gary Cooper rides him in the parade.

Carter announced his intention, as trustee of Will Rogers Memorial Fund Commission, to start plans for the conversion of Will Rogers' Santa Monica ranch into an actors home and a memorial museum. The idea will be associated with the Motion Picture Relief Fund and will establish a focus for all plans to create a haven for members of the theatrical profession who are no longer able to carry on.
