Movie Stars Go to Dallas ⁹⁰ From COWTOWN

FORT WORTH, Sept. 20 (U.P.)—Hollywood's delegation to Texas to inaugurate "The Westerner," a motion picture starring Gary Cooper, moved to Dallas today after taking part in a gala world premiere here last night.

The film was shown simultaneously at three theaters, accompanied by the personal appearance of some of screendom's most famous names. Among them were Cooper, Doris Devenport, Walter Brennan, and Lillian Bond, all of "The Westerner" cast, Producer Sam Goldwyn, Director William Wyler, Bob Hope, Edward Arnold, Bruce Cabot, Margaret Tallichet, Charlie Ruggles and Ona Munson.

A plane-load of screen writers accompanied them from Hollywood and another chartered airship brought writers from New York.

The visitors took part in a parade, attended a luncheon in their honor downtown, and a party at Publisher Amon G. Carter's farm. They will return to ~~Hollywood~~ after public appearances in Dallas tonight when the film is first shown there.

Miss Evelyn Foote of Abilene, 18-year-old freshman at Hardin-Simmons University, was chosen "Typical Texas Girl" over contestants from 23 other cities. She may accept as prize either a trip to the New York World Fair or a cash equivalent. Brown-haired, Miss Foote had won beauty contests at Graham and Dallas. She is five feet six inches tall and weighs 117 pounds.
