Fifteen Listed on First Paid Passenger Flight to New Zealand

Pioneering the first paid passenger flight to New Zealand, the American Clipper took off for out Honolulu yesterday at 4:22 p.m. from the Pan American Airways' Cabrillo Beach base.

Aboard were 15 passengers, many of them first flighters. They are scheduled to reach the South Pacific dominion within four and one-half days-compared with 17 days by steamer.
