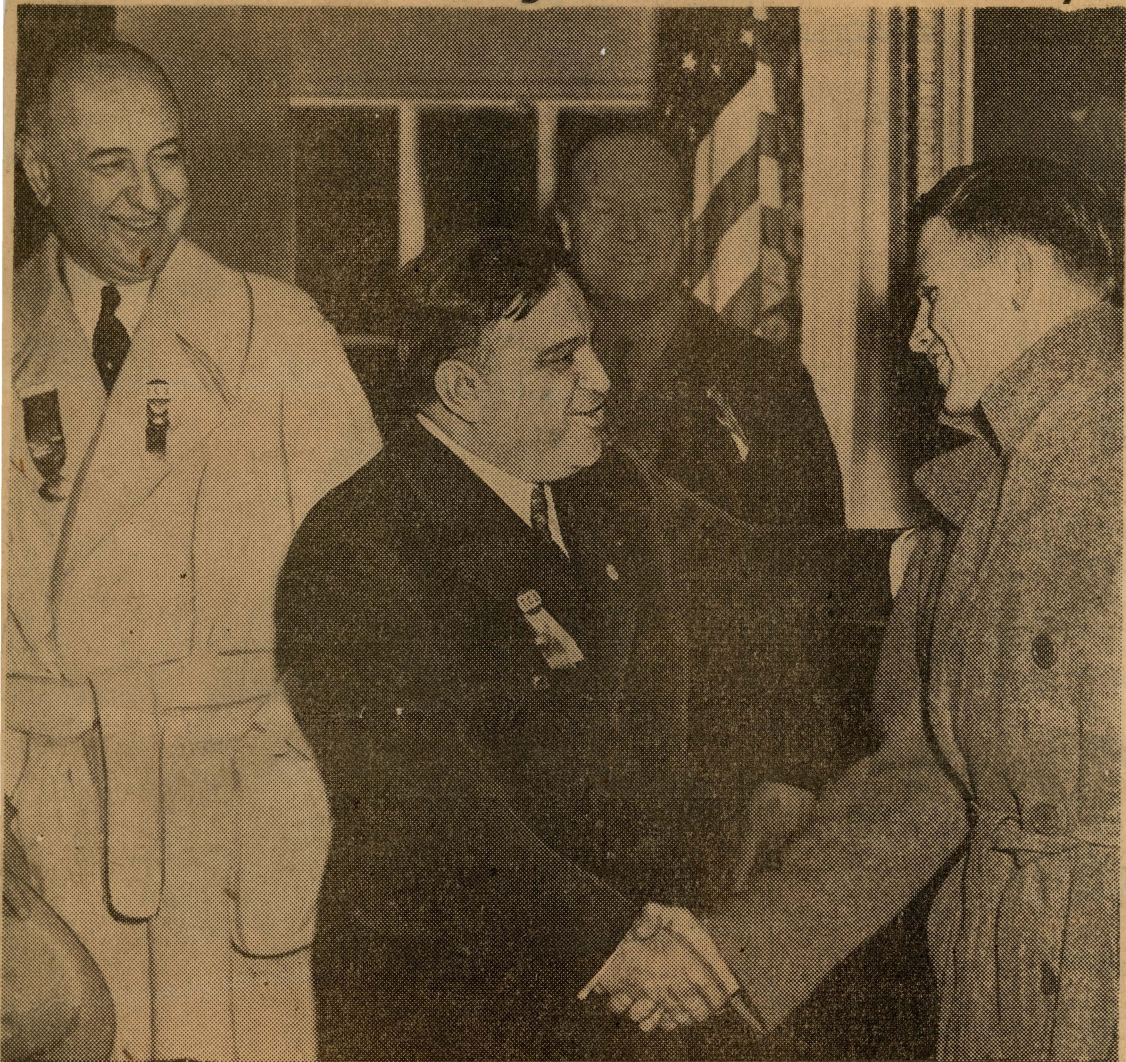

# Texas' Pride Gets Big Hand from the Mayor

## Dave O'Brien Brings All Texas In a Stagecoach for Grid Prize

With an escort of mounted cops and New York's only cowboys since the extinction of the Eleventh Ave. cowboys, Amon G. Carter, the man from Texas, and Davey O'Brien, Texas Christian's 150-pound, five-foot-seven All American quarterback, arrived at City Hall by stagecoach this afternoon to see the Mayor.

Mr. Carter, the Fort Worth publisher, and O'Brien wore ten-gallon hats, and the Mayor wore his, too, to receive them. The cowboys in the entourage were the "Sheriff's Mounted Posse, Richmond County."

"I hope you're better luck than you were before," Mr. Carter told the Mayor. "I came to see you last year when we played Fordham, and the score was 7 to 6."

"I can root for you this time," the Mayor said, referring to the forthcoming Texas Christian-Carnegie Tech game in the Sugar Bowl, New

Orleans. "I have to live with the Fordham boys."

Davey, who is to receive the John W. Heisman Memorial Trophy at the Downtown Athletic Club tonight, awarded annually to the best football player in the country, pretended to throw a pass with his ten-gallon hat.

"That's some pass, that is," the Mayor jeered.
