Dear Amon:

Your letter of the sixteenth just reaches me, forwarded here.

On the picture sent you which has five people in a row are Bill Rogers; Irvin Cobb; Mrs. Emma Kerns, the 80-year old aunt of Mrs. McIntyre; Odd McIntyre; and myself.

This was taken in April, 1934, when Odd and Maybelle and Mrs. Kerns came out to California with us. That trip was quite remarkable from the time we left New York until we got back. Mrs. Kerns had never been west of Chicago. As above suggested, she was 80 years old but as lively as a hundred Texas crickets (if you have crickets in Texas) and positively brilliant in her mental processes.

On the same afternoon Bill went out and hitched up his mules to the stage coach and I acted as outrider. We picked up Mrs. Kerns at the ranch house. She was in the front seat with Bill. In the second seat were Mrs. Will Hays, Buff Cobb (Irvin's daughter) and Billie Burke. In the rear seat were Irvin Cobb and Mrs. Rogers.

We went up the mountain with Buddy Sterling, Bill's top hand, and myself doing some monkey business as outriders. Coming down, the hold back strap broke and the mules ran away and it looked like it might be a catastrophe.

Odd wrote the whole thing up in the COSMOPOLITAN, I think the following August, when these pictures were both used. You want to read the story. I



thought you would be interested in the pictures.

We got out here Sunday and will be here two or three weeks.
