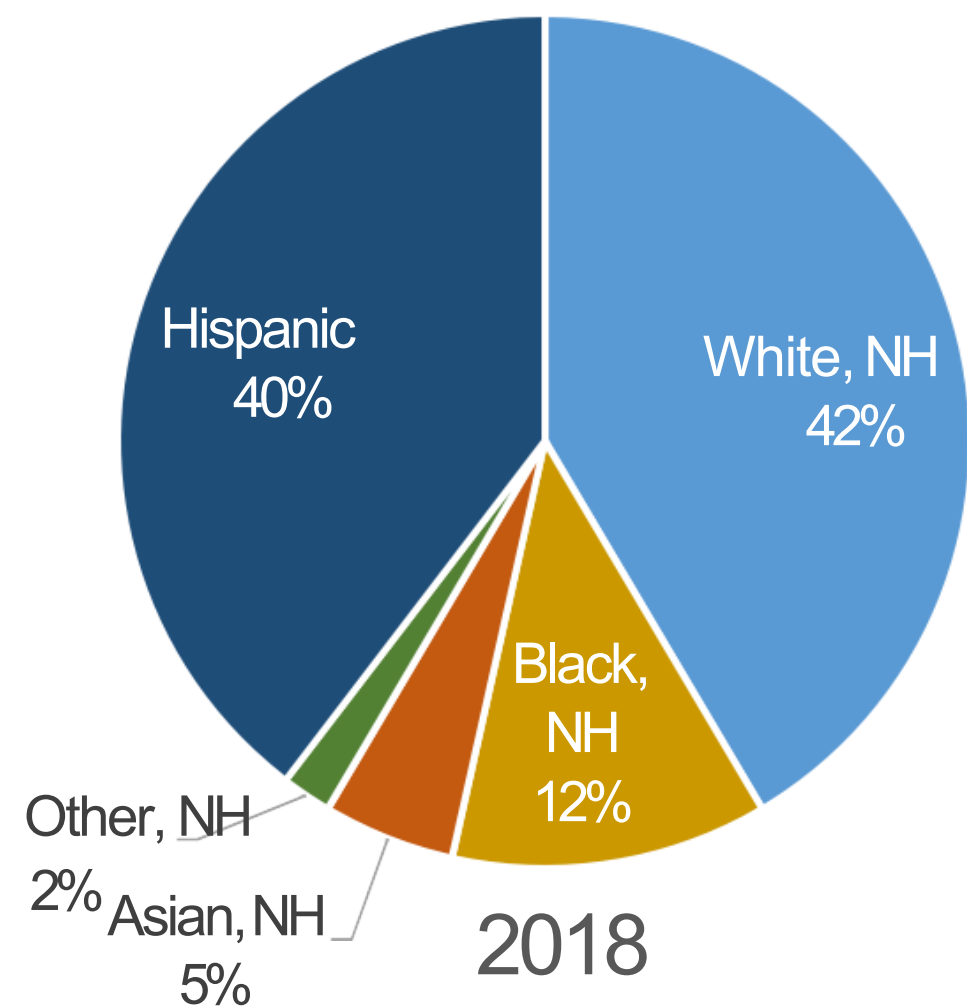

# Prevailing Juan Crow

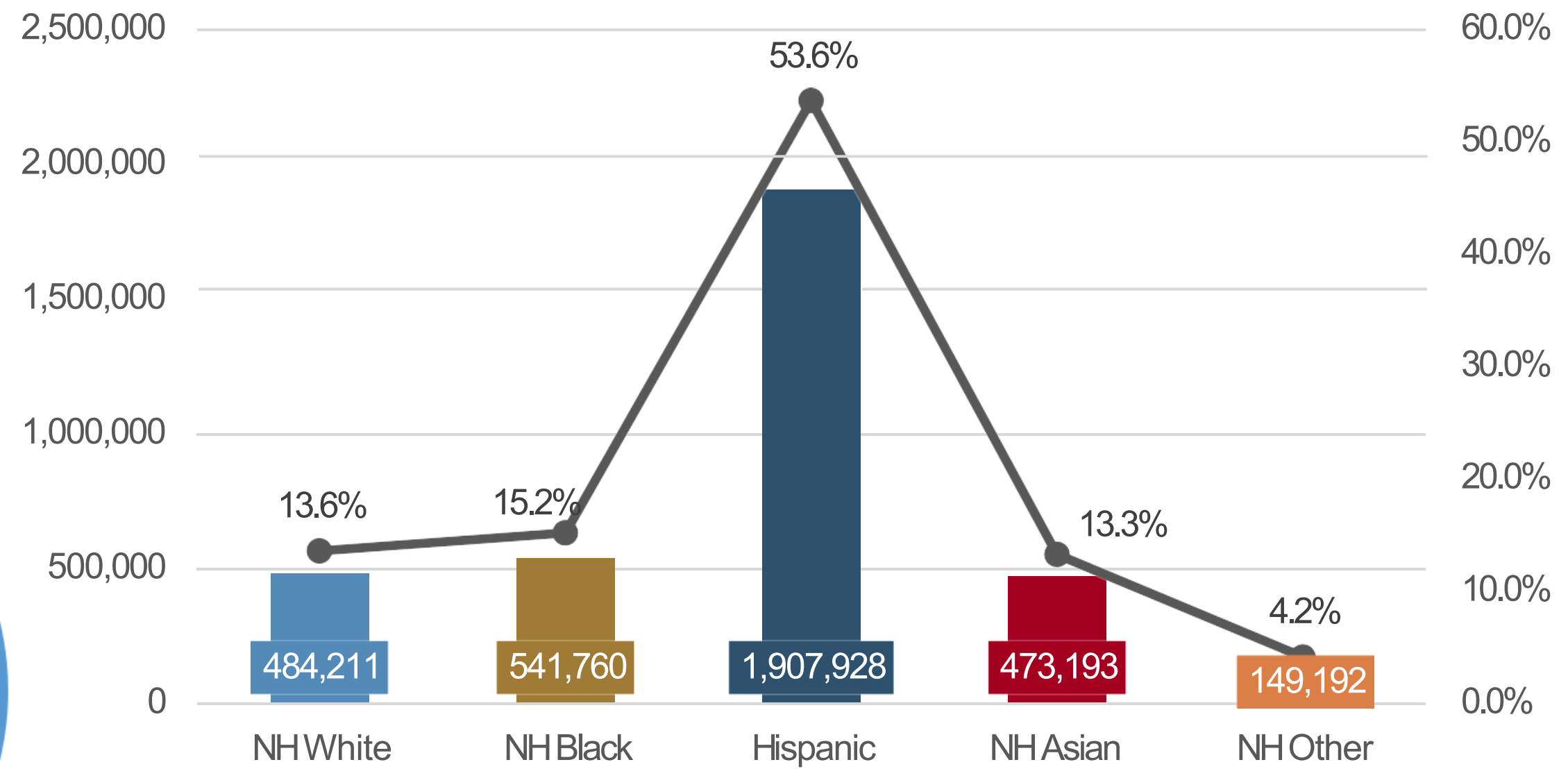
