

PAID CITY CIRCULATION NOW 8,383



ESPITE the flood period, which played havoc on no less than four of The Telegram's city carrier routes, The Telegram during the mouth of May made the largest gain in PAID city circulation that it has in four or five months, a fact that is truly remarkable, because it was believed on May 1, when the actual paid city circulation almost topped the 8,000 figure, that a high-water mark was reached. But May brought a bigger surprise than April. On May 1 the actual paid city circulation was 7.915. On June 1 the actual paid city circulation was 8,383.

The Telegram still maintains that its paid city circulation is greater than the combined paid city circulation of both the other Fort Worth dail newspapers

Figures always talk louder than words. The Telegram is the only Fort Worth newspaper printing any circulation figures. Here are figures by carrier routes, boundaries to which will be furnished to any advertiser interested. Note the following comparative figures:
