

Chicago, Oct 6--Amos Carter, who headed a delegation of Texans to the world's series, seemed right at home in Chicago as did the rest of the boosters from the Lone Star state who had come to root for the White Sox. Carter, who is publisher of the Fort Worth Star-Telegram, stands among the persistent and consistent boosters of the Sox and Comiskey in the South. He said tonight:

"I wouldn't have missed this world's series if they had been forced to carry me here on a stretcher. And don't imagine the series is over. It takes five games on the winning end to take the championship. We have watched the Sox for years, and they are the greatest bunch in the world to come up from behind. The Sox still have a kick. Now that they are forced to the wall they are likely to show the world everything they have."

These Texans, whose state helped train the Sox this year, just as it did in 1917, when they captured the world's championship, feel a proprietary interest in the club. The Sox's training home is at Mineral Wells, a short distance from Fort worth. The Rangers have plunged heavily on Chicago to win the series. They are rolling in wealth in Texas and anyone who wants a good wager can still get money down if he'll just look up Carter and his bunch.
