The flag-raising ceremonies at Panther Park Thursday, aside from the fact that they may have jinxed the Champion Cats, were about as nifty as anything ever observed on the local ball field. The speech-making by Robert K. Hanger, commander of

Bothwell Kane Post, American Legion, and the presentation of emblems to individual Cats of last year's crew by Amon G. Carter and A. M. Keisker, were short enough to please the most restless. Lieut. C. W. Bradley, formerly of the Thirty-sixth Division, handled his "rookies" composed of men in uniform and diamond bespangled players, many of whom had seen service, as smooth, as oil. There were 3,295 paid customers in the park, which means that with the soldier guests and the regular passes, there must have been more than 3,500 people present.
