

SCHEDULE FOR FINAL EXAMINATIONS -- SPRING 1942

Seven days have been set aside for the Final Examinations this Spring. For the most part only two examination periods are noted in each day - 8 A.M. and 1:00 P.M., however there are a few exceptions occasioned by special period and group demands.

The days for the finals include May 27,28,29,30, June 1,2,3. Approximately two and one-half hours have been set aside for each examination. Small classes meeting at odd hours should be checked first with the Registrar before the time is announced. Examinations not included in the schedule may be given at the discretion of the teacher provided they come within the above time schedule.

Please grade papers of all doubtful students immediately after the examination and report all failing students immediately thereafter. This will help with summer registration.

All grades are to reach the Registrar's Office not later than Monday, June 8. We serve our patrons with Promptness through the combined promptness of all concerned.

EXAMINATIONS ON JUNE SENIORS ARE TO BE GIVEN AT THE DISCRETION OF THE TEACHER AND NOT LATER THAN TUESDAY, May 26, that the grades may be in the Registrar's Office not later than Thursday morning 9 o'clock, May 28. As far as possible avoid giving Senior exams earlier than the 24th.
