RECORDS ON ABSENCES

In keeping with the policy adopted last spring, we are requesting all faculty members to note in the blank space of the extreme left hand edge of the grade sheet the total number of absences opposite the name of each student, covering the entire fall semester.

Please keep in mind, also, that frequent and persistent absences tend to lower the student's grade; for the sake of uniformity in grading, note the grading and point system on page 25 in our catalog. Also, note our policy regarding absences according to pages 26 and 27. The administration will thank you for your earnest endeavor to carry out this policy.

PRINTING OF EXAM QUESTIONS
