WHAT TO DO NOW

Now, the same old story, make sure you have an "Admit to Class" card stamped by the Business Office for each civilian in your class. This is imperative. There can be no exceptions. Call your roll and if there is anyone (without this card in your hand) send the student immediately to the Business Office.
