### TO THE TEACHING STAFF

Final examinations for Seniors graduating February 27, 1944, are to be given not later than Tuesday, the 22nd, and their grades must be in the Registrar's Office by noon, Wednesday, February 23. See list of candidates on page 2 of Faculty Bulletin dated February 10.

Final examinations for all others are to be given during the last 50 minute recitation period of the trimester, February 28 or 29. Students are not to be held beyond the first bell. Trimester grades are due in the Registrar's Office on March 1. The Cabinet of Department Heads has agreed that any deviation from the above must be approved by the Registrar or Dean. We must have every V-12 man's grade by noon March 1.

Do not give a student a special examination unless he presents a Special Examination Permit signed by the Registrar or Dean and marked "Paid" by the Business Office. I am sure you will cooperate with him in these matters.
