

TO MEMBERS OF THE FACULTY:

In our basketball game of last Monday night with Loyola, some of our students engaged in the dangerous practice of throwing pennies on the floor and in other ways showed certain tendencies toward unsportsmanlike conduct.

The Athletic Department would like to discourage these tendencies as much as possible. Through the years our students have been singularly courteous and gracious to visiting teams and game officials. While other conference schools have had considerable trouble with rowdy elements in the student body, we have enjoyed exemplary conduct. We would like to see our students continue to merit the approbation of all concerned.

We urge, therefore, that each teacher take the opportunity to impress upon his students the importance of maintaining proper decorum before the Public. This can be accomplished only by rigid adherence to the rules of the game and the principles of good conduct whatever the circumstances may be.

At T.C.U., we believe and practice Faculty control of athletics and we, therefore, beg your enthusiastic cooperation in the important matter of building and maintaining the proper spirit on our campus.

Many of our faculty members are new on the campus and cannot be thoroughly aware of the policies which control our athletic program; and many of the older faculty members have little occasion for contact with them. At the earliest favorable time I hope to have the opportunity of discussing with you some of the principles that are fundamental in the daily conduct of our intercollegiate sports affairs.
