FINAL EXAMINATIONS

January 20-25 will be the dates for the Fall Semester final examinations. Three two-hour periods will be scheduled daily; two in the morning and two in the afternoon, closing at noon the 25th. This schedule will be presented to department heads Jan. 3.

All grades on "Admit to Class" cards and on grade sheets must be in the Registrar's Office by 9:00 A.M. January 27th. Earlier reports, shortly after the exam for each course has been completed and papers graded, will be appreciated for we have no time except Saturday afternoon and Sunday between exam days and the beginning of Spring Semester registration.

REGISTRATION FOR THE SPRING SEMESTER

Three days, January 27, 28, and 29, will be given over to registration of returning students, both those who are now in attendance and those scheduled to return from previous attendance. The students will register by letters of the alphabet. Later announcement will give further detail.

New students will be registered January 30th.

X-Ray Examinations will again be available during the week of Registration. Faculty members who have not availed themselves of this opportunity may have this service.

Student Record Books and Petition Sheets are being brought up to date in preparation for the Spring Semester registration.

Department heads are urged to make as much advanced preparation as possible toward the registration of their majors to speed the process on the days of registration.
