THOSE ADMIT TO CLASS CARDS

Please remember that for each and every student you are teaching an "Admit to Class" white card must be in your hand. This must bear the "OK" stamp of the Business Office and must be preserved. These cards are to be turned in at the end of the Spring Semester along with the grade sheets. Keep your record of absences on these cards.

If you have in any of your classes a student without a corresponding "Admit to Class" card in your hand, send him to the Business Office immediately after class for settlement of his account. Make sure all of your cards have the Business Office "OK". If you discover one without this designation, send the student to the Business Office with the card, to be returned to you after account has been cleared.

THOSE "I" GRADES
