CONCERNING ABSENCES

The official general policy of the University concerning student absences, as accepted by the President and the Deans' Council is as follows:

No assigned work is to be excused on account of the absence; therefore, no absences are officially "excused". The instructor is to determine the effect of an absence or absences on a student's work in his class, since the effect may vary according to a student's ability and the nature of the course. There is no objection to an understanding among faculty members within a department concerning uniformity in dealing with absences in the same type of course. It is suggested that all instructors have an understanding with their students that there is no certain number of times which any student may be absent without affecting his standing in a class.

Students should understand that frequent absences will reduce their grades, and excessive absences will endanger their passing the course. The eventual result will be left to the instructor in view of the manner in which the student overcomes the effects of his absences.
