The sample sent is an igneous rock resembling a diorite and is definitly not a meteorite. It would not be uncommon for some magnitite to occur in a diorite. The sample is being returned in this letter.

I suppose you will want some reprints. I told Leonard we should have 100 copies, but I find they are to be ordered directly from S. A.
