Trip of July 1, 1954. Mr. _____ of the the local newspaper, had never heard of the meteorite, or had perhaps heard of it but did not know his former employer, the previous editor of the paper, had had any connection with it. This man, Mr. _____, married a second time later in life, and I visited his widow, but she recalled nothing about the meteorite, and said her husband had never mentioned it to her.

The farm on which the meteorite was found is still intact as the same 160 A. tract, and there I talked to Mrs. Arnold Diehn and daughters, but they knew nothing about it. This farm is 2.3 miles from the signal light intersection or "center" of Arlington.

I also visited neighbors: on the south, Mrs. Fred H. Panning; on the north, Mrs. Eldon Tiegs; to the west, across the highway, Henry Rolf and Martin Jahr. Mrs. Diehn sees Joe R. Barry occasionally, and knew he was still living in Georgia; she referred me to a man in town who would have the address.

In Arlington, I found Mrs. August Gable, and she gave Joe R. Barry's address as 1127 Morata Sano Ave., Augusta, Ga. She said Mrs. McLeod, Joe's sister, had lived for a while in the nearby town of Slayton, but died last year.
