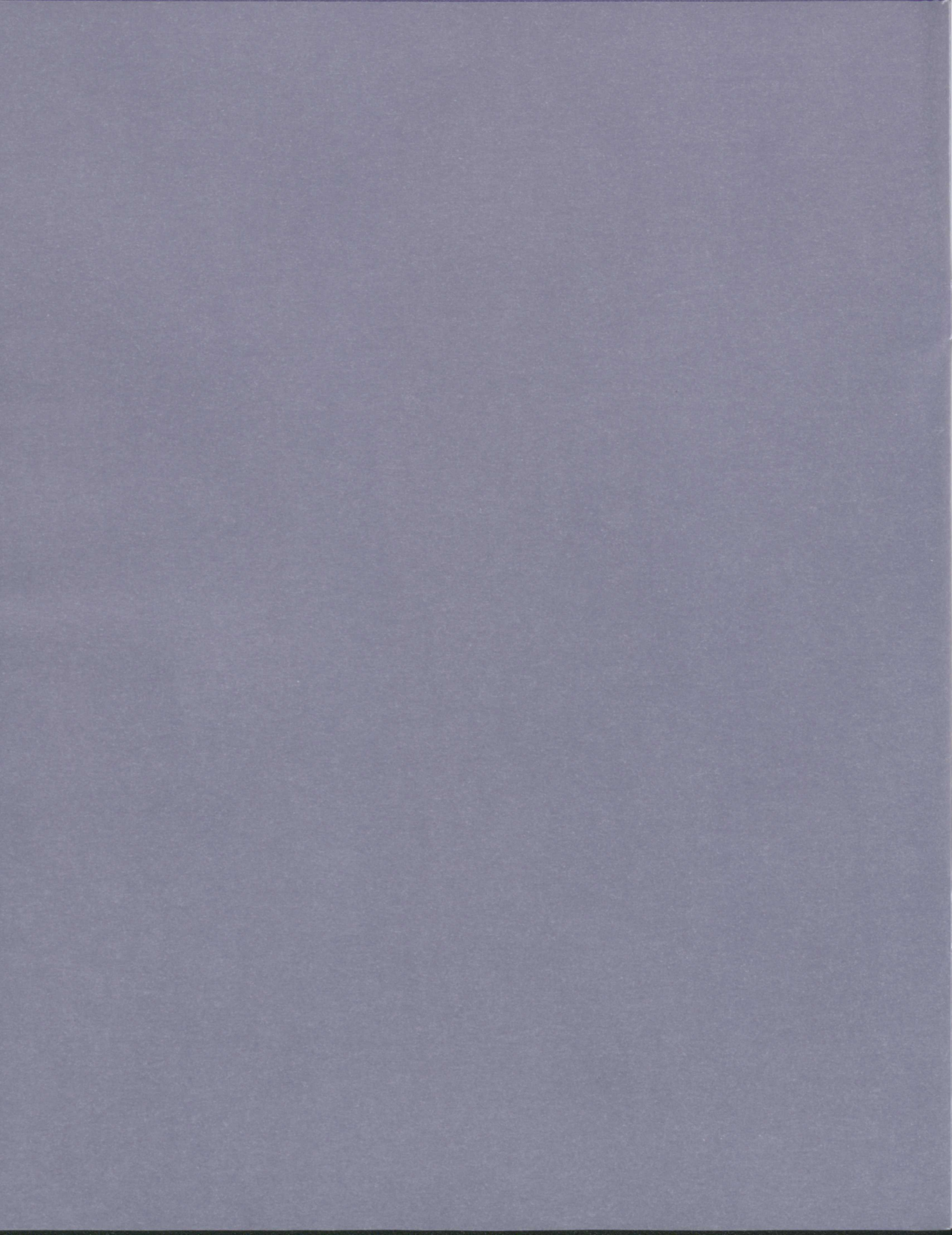

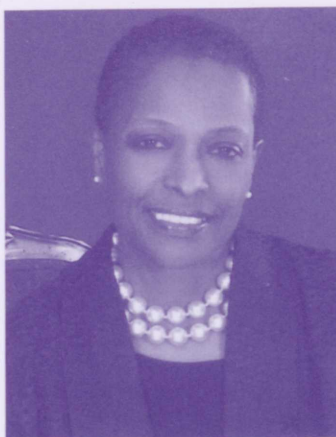

DR. JENNIFER GIDDINGS BROOKS

When friends and colleagues are asked to describe Dr. Jennifer Giddings Brooks, words like “community-focused,” “mentor” and “servant-leader” are used. Dr. Brooks has a distinguished record in both educational administration and community service. She has worked at every level of education — elementary school through college — including her work as a research evaluator, Texas Education Agency Professional Service Provider and educational consultant. As an evaluator, she published numerous abstracts and articles. Her passion for research was recently celebrated with the dedication of two historical markers in downtown Fort Worth and the completion of her first book.



Deeply committed to her community, Dr. Brooks serves or has provided leadership on the boards of numerous nonprofit agencies, including the Fort Worth Art Commission, as president of the YWCA, as chair of the Congressional Education Task Force, as co-chair of the United Negro College Fund, as vice chair of Texas Health Harris Methodist Hospital/Community Impact, as vice president of Fort Worth Opera, as education chair of Performing Arts Fort Worth (Bass Hall), and as secretary of the I.M. Terrell Academy foundation board as well as that of the Fort Worth African American Museum and Cultural Center. She is also a member of The Links, Incorporated, and The Society, Incorporated, Supporting the Arts.

Dr. Brooks has been honored with several awards, including Legacy in Education, Power of One, Bank of America's Local Hero, Outstanding Texan, Outstanding

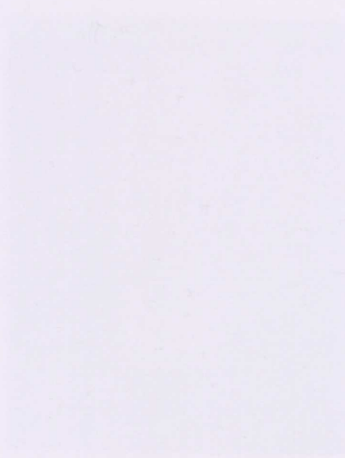
Woman of Fort Worth and Great Woman of Texas. She received a special commendation from the 106th U.S. Congress and in 2021, her portrait was unveiled at the Dee J. Kelly Alumni & Visitors Center at TCU.

During her time at TCU, Dr. Brooks was involved in student government and was the first Black TCU student tapped for membership in the Mortar Board national honor society. In 1970, she became the first Black homecoming queen at TCU and in the Southwest Conference, which generated national news stories in *Jet* magazine and other publications. After graduation, her service to the university continued as a member of the National Alumni Association Board and two boards of visitors, and as a guest speaker, adjunct professor, student mentor and the inaugural director for the Center for Urban Education, where learning experiences were provided and vital resources were disseminated to support underserved schools in Tarrant County.

A Dallas native, Dr. Brooks started her collegiate career with the World Campus Afloat/Semester at Sea program through Chapman College in Orange, California, which took her to 16 countries around the globe. After earning her bachelor's and master's degrees in speech pathology at TCU, she completed her doctoral studies at Texas Woman's University. She also took graduate courses at the University of London in England.

Dr. Brooks is married to Tarrant County Commissioner Roy Charles Brooks. They have two children — both attorneys — Royce Gigi Brooks and Marion Giddings Brooks.

DR. VICTOR J. BOSCHINI, JR. TCU'S 10TH CHANCELLOR

Texas Christian University is approaching its Sesquicentennial in 2023, prompting plans for celebration as well as reflection upon TCU's rich heritage and traditions over the span of 150 years. Chancellor Victor J. Boschini, Jr., is the 10th Chancellor and follows in the footsteps of other strong leaders with each chancellor taking TCU to new heights. His leadership style could be described as optimistic and open to the ideas of others; yet, he is willing to make the tough decisions when necessary.

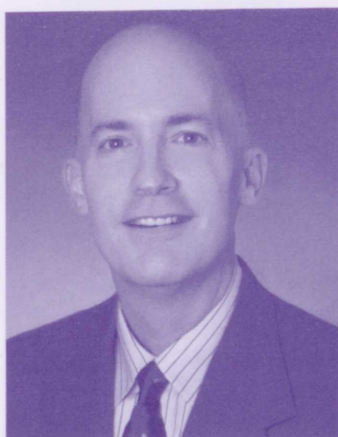
Chancellor and TCU's First Lady, Megan Boschini, consider themselves fortunate to have been a part of the University for the past 20 years. During that time, they have set a tone as a couple that emphasizes a "place at the table" for all members of the ever-growing TCU community. As part of his traditional message at commencement, the Chancellor promotes the importance of civility in today's society, challenging graduates to perform acts of kindness and assume the best in others. This "be kind — pass it on" message is vintage Chancellor Boschini and part of the growing movement of inclusiveness on campus. Chancellor Boschini considers himself fortunate to have a great partner in his wife, Megan, as they work together to advance all things TCU in a variety of venues.

TCU today is much different from the tiny prairie school that the Clark brothers, Addison and Randolph, started back in 1873.

The TCU of today is a vibrant learning community with approximately 12,000 students (10,300 undergraduates and 1,700 graduate students) and over 2,300 faculty/staff members. Combine the TCU student body and workforce with over 98,000 graduates and you have a thriving enterprise where students come first and faculty and staff are valued for the enormous contribution they make to the growth and development of their students.

Topping the list of TCU's academic initiatives is the Anne Burnett Marion School of Medicine in Fort Worth. The Burnett School of Medicine with classes on the TCU campus will eventually produce 240 MDs in Fort Worth with specialized training as empathetic medical professionals who treat patients with compassion and ingenuity. Referred to as Dorman Scholars, the first class of students began their studies on July 8, 2019. The Chancellor is extremely grateful to local philanthropist, H. Paul Dorman, for agreeing to provide full scholarships to each member of this inaugural class.

While TCU has grown in both size and splendor, its upward trajectory toward greater distinction as an institution has been guided since 2003 by its strategic process, *Vision in Action*. TCU is currently in the third phase of the strategic process, *Vision in Action: Lead On*. Under the direction of the Board of Trustees, the strategic plan includes four goals centered on 1) strengthening academic profile and reputation; 2) strengthening endowment; 3) strengthening the TCU experience and campus culture; and 4) strengthening the workforce: both employees and graduates. The Board also outlined a priority commitment



to several building projects over the next three to five years.

Three themes that have emerged as foundational to TCU's institutional goals and key to the University's strategic priorities include diversity and inclusion; a highly engaging TCU academic and student life experience; and student support with an integrated and holistic student success model. Efforts are underway to implement the plan in alignment with annual budgeting and assessment, with development of a dashboard to monitor progress over the course of the next few years.

Fundraising is in progress for institutional priorities embodied in this bold and ambitious strategic plan, with TCU currently in the leadership gift phase of Lead On: A Campaign for TCU. At the April 2019 meeting of the Board of Trustees, the Board approved a \$1 billion campaign goal. This goal signifies the Board's intent to sustain momentum at a critical time with strong leadership in place, to solidify TCU's place among its peer aspirant schools, and to deliver real-world impact.

Chancellor and Mrs. Boschini are actively engaged on campus and in the greater Fort Worth community, which strengthens the stature of TCU as Fort Worth's University. The Boschinis frequently host groups of students, faculty/staff and graduates at Minor House and attend a variety of campus events and activities. Typically, they participate in Frog Camp where they enjoy meeting new students each summer. In the past, they have been privileged to accompany incoming students to London, Paris and Seville, along with Washington, D.C., Savannah, New Orleans, and our very own Fort Worth. Dr. Boschini also teaches a class called *The American University Experience* each fall in the College of Education.

As First Lady, Megan Boschini has made it her goal to showcase TCU in the best light possible — from entertaining countless groups at their home to interacting with students on campus in various fine arts and athletic settings. She has been active in a variety of community boards and organizations, and currently serves on the board of Gill Children's Services and Modern Art Museum.

Chancellor Boschini sits on the boards of the Fort Worth Symphony Orchestra, the Van Cliburn Foundation, Moncrief Cancer Institute, and the University of Mount Union Board of Trustees. Chancellor Boschini recently received recognition from the Institute of International Education with the IIE Centennial Medal.

Chancellor Boschini came to TCU from Illinois State University, where he served as president. Prior to that, he held administrative and teaching positions at DePauw, Butler and Indiana universities.

Chancellor and Mrs. Boschini are committed to ensuring that TCU continues on the pathway toward reaching its vision as a world-class, values-centered university, and one that offers a premier campus experience. They both believe that we share the responsibility — and the honor — to shape and transform the leaders who will shape and transform our world.

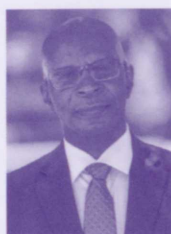

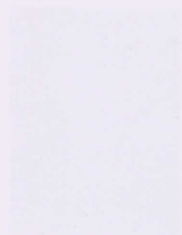

INTERNATIONAL FLAGS

The 25 flags displayed on the arena floor represent the countries of our 44 international students who are receiving their diplomas today. The following countries are represented: Australia, Canada, China, Costa Rica, Denmark, Ecuador, El Salvador, Ethiopia, France, Germany, Hungary, India, Jamaica, Kenya, Nicaragua, Nigeria, Panama, Russian Federation, Slovakia, Somalia, Turks and Caicos Islands, United Kingdom, Venezuela, Vietnam and Zimbabwe.

THE UNIVERSITY MACE

The mace is a symbol of the strength of a university. In medieval times, the mace was a weapon designed to protect the dignitary in a procession. Academia borrowed that tradition from royalty designating it as a symbol of the power of a university and of its leader – power shared with the faculty. Maces, similar in appearance to ancestral weaponry, usually are constructed of wood or metal and may have symbols of the institution worked into the design. Texas Christian University's mace was created to commemorate the inauguration of Chancellor Michael R. Ferrari in 1999. TCU staff member, Robert Kramer, a master carver, made the shaft of the mace. It is fashioned from a wooden beam from the first building constructed at AddRan Male and Female College in Thorp Spring, Texas. The head of the mace was created by international sculptor and TCU parent, Seppo Aarnos, and proudly bears the horned frog, adopted in 1897 as the university's mascot. An amethyst at the center of the head glows with the colors purple for royalty and white for purity.

TRADITION OF ACADEMIC DRESS

The history of academic dress dates from at least the twelfth century, when long gowns were needed for warmth in the unheated buildings used by medieval scholars. In England, both Oxford and Cambridge made academic dress a matter of university surveillance, and both institutions regulated which colors and trim could be used by faculty and students. In May 1895, representatives from American institutions of higher learning met at Columbia University and formulated a "code of academic dress" which has generally been followed since that time, although some revisions were initiated in 1932 and in 1960.

The dress code recommended that gowns for the bachelor's degree should be worn closed and should have pointed sleeves. Gowns for the master's degree can be worn open or closed, but their sleeves are oblong in shape with open wrists. Gowns worn by those holding the doctoral degree also can be worn open or closed and feature bell shaped sleeves.

Gowns from different institutions vary in color, but most are black. Neither the bachelors' nor the masters' gowns feature trim, but doctoral gowns are faced down the front with black velvet and hold three bars of the same fabric across the sleeves. Sometimes these facings and sleeve-bars are velvet of the color distinctive of the subject to which the degree pertains, thus agreeing in color with the binding or edging of the hood appropriate to the particular doctoral degree of the wearer.

Hoods are to be of the same color and material as the gowns and are lined with the official color(s) of the college

or university conferring the degree. Bindings or edgings for the hoods display the color distinctive of the subject to which the degree pertains. Bachelors' hoods are three feet in length; masters' hoods are three and one-half feet in length; doctoral hoods measure four feet in length.

For all academic purposes, including the trimmings of gowns, hoods, and tassels, the colors associated with the different academic fields are as follows:

With just 13 students, they opened the doors of AddRan Male and Female College in 1873, one of the first coed institutions west of the Mississippi.

The school officially became Texas Christian University in 1902. Eight years later, a campus fire forced TCU to find a new location. Fort Worth's city leaders felt a college might soften their rowdy "cow town" reputation. The promise of 50 acres, \$200,000 and streetcar service sealed the deal on Fort Worth becoming TCU's permanent home.

TCU and Fort Worth enjoyed a successful partnership of growth, mutual enrichment and community throughout the 20th century, but the new millennium brought unprecedented cultural and physical progress to the university.

Embracing the Present

TCU is now a top national university in one of the country's most populous metropolitan areas. Through decades of strategic planning, vision and generosity, we've developed programs and a campus that will address the needs of the coming century.

Today, students hailing from 76 nations and representing more than 60 faiths enjoy the benefits of a Big 12 school with excellent academics delivered in a uniquely personal setting. The Horned Frog family includes approximately 12,000 current students who are still seeking an empowering educational atmosphere, 2,300 faculty and staff who are dedicated to supporting our thriving academic community, and a worldwide network of more than 98,000 living alumni.



As TCU looks forward, it also looks back. That's why the university established the Race & Reconciliation Initiative, an academically based effort to examine TCU and its founders' history to inform and shape a brighter future.

Years ago, our beloved institution was created as an enriching place for men and women of character to acquire a liberal arts education while leading the way for the greater good.

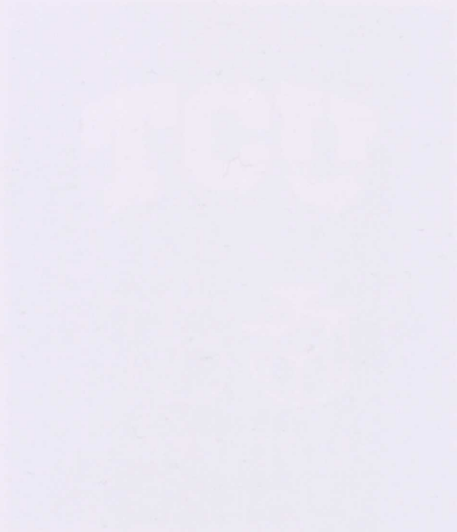
