What interests me greatly is that in correspondence with the State Geological Survey at Lawrence it develops that there definitely was a third stone of 52% pounds found in the SWA of the SWA of the NWA of SEC. 31, Township 31 S, Range 2 E. in Summer County. With good maps of the region I finally got, these three stones line up almost exactly and are so nearly in line as to present a remarkable picture. Pretty clearly when this old meteorite it was coming in on a low angle and one wonders how many other pieces might be along this line or extensions of it.

I doubt if the Kansas geologists have done anything more about it, but I would like to go in there are talk to the people farming this region thru which this line runs. It would take a day or two of canvassing. I figure you are familiar with the neighborhood and maybe even the paple, and could be a great help to me. Are these places fammed by owners or tenants?

I thought I could come to Wichita by train or plane some Saturday. If you could meet me and go with me SAturday and Sunday I think we could do a pretty good job, as the geological survey maps indicate that this area, like most ferming regions, now has very few houses or inhabitants. On this occasion I would want to do only visiting and talking. If things looked favorable, we could consider going back in later with a metal detector, which I think might work on these stones--but this is real labor, to cover any amount of territory by walking over it in name w strips at a time!

I would glady pay your car expenses and any other reasonable sum you would charge, or I could rent a car if you don't have one. Let me hear from you in a tentative way.
