Dear Mr. Monnig,

I received your letter and was very happy to hear from you. I have not been able to look at a map of the county as of yet to see where this third meteorite might have fallen but of course I am very familiar with the terrain on which I found the other two. The land on which the first was found is farmed by the owner, a friend of mine. The second find was made on our place. Both of these stones probably were uncovered by erosion and both were found under similar circumstances--plowing. I could show you almost the exact spot where the second stone was found but only the approximate location of the first. This find was made some 16 years ago when I was only 16 years old. We were Tennants of the ground at that time. This farm has since been sold. The location of the first find was due south of the second and in the adjoining quarter section.

I would encourage your coming some weekend and would insist that you be a guest in our home during this time. I could not think of charging you anything. The best time, as far as I am concerned would be sometime after October 15 as I will be tied up with farm work and wheat planting prior to this date.

We tried something different this past summer, market gardening. My wife and I put out 5,000 tomato plants, put in an irrigation well and sold tomatoes commercially. Needless to say, this kept us out of trouble for awhile.
