Gentlemen:

I met your correspondent, Mrs. Robert Fleming, on the Ambrose Road north of Bells last Saturday, and gave her a story on our survey of the September 9th fireball and subsequent canvassing efforts in a search for meteorites.

We first determine as nearly as we can by traveling around it the true path of the fireball and the end point especially.

Then we talk to people under the last part of the path and a few miles on each side urging them to be on the lookout for meteorites.

In this case there is a pretty good gamble that there is a larger piece of the meteorite (size cannot be predicted) that ended in the Red River bottoms. It is barely possible it went as far north as Carpenter's Bluff, or perhaps on across the river in Oklahoma.

If in Oklahoma, it should be near what is shown on a map I have as Kemp City (not Kemp), but I was in this place a week ago and it has a different name now that I can't recall. The final parts of the meteorite should be west of "Kemp City", and I would like especially to hear from any observer who was outdoors within two or three miles of Kemp City and saw the actual ending of the fireball.
