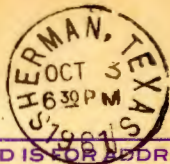

Dear Mr. McBride:

Thanks for writing me. If you can just hold the specimen you have, I'll be glad to check it the first time I am thru Sherman, which I hope will be within a week or two.

Actually, we do not expect any of the meteorite to be found in Sherman, because it is too far from the path. See the enclosed mimeographed sheet. The fireball was probably not over 6 or 8 miles high when it went about over Bellis, and I don't think a piece could be thrown as far as Sherman.

But I'll be glad to see this. The "shiny spots" don't sound quite right, but the color is. Don't grind on this piece as my standard meteorite circular suggests, because if it should be a piece of the Sept. 9th fall it is rather crumbly and grinding would be too rough on it.
