I saw it in its entirety from the moment it appeared in the
southeastern sky until it broke up to the north east of us. I was
lying on an open sleeping porch at our home on Grapevine lake and
just happened to be watching the stars. It first appeared as a long
greenish flash and left a greenish gaseous trail in its wake. When
it exploded firey pieces fell away from it and in a few seconds
only the trail was visible. It seemed so close that I almost expected
it to fall sizzling into the lake to the east of our house. I would
say that between eight and ten seconds elapsed before we heard the
sound of the explosion itself and this seemed to be a series of small
"pops" after the first large boom.

As this happened approximately a half hour after I have seen
one of our satellites cross the sky several evenings I thought it
might be a section of one breaking away from the main body.
