I am very interested in learning about the condition of the Bells meteorite sample which was analyzed by John Oro (University of Houston). Professor Oro has told me that he received the sample about 5 November 1964 from Brian Mason (then at the American Museum of Natural History), and that Mason had received the stone from you.

Mason described the sample as "the freshest material of Bells which I have available. It consists of two fragments broken from a single piece."

Your original communication in <u>Meteoritics</u> notes that some of the material later recovered and added to your collection had been subjected to hurricane rains. Was Orô's sample collected before or after the hurricane?
