Thank you for writing me about the possible meteorite you are keeping for me.

It may be a few days before I can get up there, but I will try to see you soon and check this.

Actually the meteorites we found from the fall of Sept/ 9, 1961, were of a peculiar kind that are somewhat different from most meteorites in being lighter than ordinary rocks in weight and also quite easily crushed or crumbled. I really don't see how one of these could have lasted over two years.

However, if the rock you have is different from the country rocks, it could be a meteorite of some sort, and I'll be able to tell when I examine it. Meantime, please don't break it up but keep it just as you found it. Thanks again, and you'll see me one of these days.
