THIS STONY METEORITE LANDED JUST FOUR FEET FROM THE HEAD OF A SLEEPING CAMPER IN BLACK MOSHANNON STATE PARK, CENTRE CO., PA. IT WAS EMBEDDED IN AN OAK TREE BY THE FORCE OF THE IMPACT.

THE FINDER, MR. ROBERT REID OF PHILADELPHIA, BROUGHT IT TO THE ACADEMY TO BE IDENTIFIED. NOTICE THE BLACK FUSION CRUST AND THE TINY ROUND GRAINS, CALLED "CHONDRULES," WHICH ARE PRESENT IN MANY STONY METEORITES.
