I have not cut this specimen so can not classify it. It is a black stone with specks of iron showing and a dark brown crust.

It fell about 9 P.M. May 1906. I do not know the day.

I obtained it from a Mr. Keeley of Blackwell.

It seems to be a complete stone and from what I could learn it is not part of a shower. Hope you find something.

I have a light colored stone from Colorado that looks something like the Norton fall.

I was very much disappointed last year in not obtaining a specimen of the Norton meteorite. I was prepared to make a good exchange.

I would like very much to go to Los Angeles but am afraid the trip is a little to expensive for me.
