

Extracts from letter from H. O. Stockwell, Box 563,
Hutchinson, Kansas, to Olivier, 1947 Sep. 24.

"The writer has been interested in meteorites since I witnessed one ~~fall~~ in 1934. Last week took time off to look in the Brenham field (Kiowa Co., Kans.), and located a nice stone about two feet deep. It is similar in shape to Fig. 17 in Nininger's book (1933), except ~~with~~ surface more even around edge and the pits on rounded side very uniform about size of golf balls. There was about three inches of loose scale on under side and ground for two feet to edge had turned yellow. The stone was weighed on wagon scales in amount of 740 lbs. There may be a couple lbs. of loose scale on the stone yet.

Would consider this a nice specimen. Will truck it home some time ^{new} next month and place on display in our parts room. The past ^{new} days have received several leads on single stones within a radius of 50 miles of Hutchinson. May have other finds to report later.
