Dear Mr. Huss:

I am shipping the Kiowa County, Kansas (Brenham) iron to you by express prepaid today for refinishing and re-etching of the sawn surface.

The pallasitic portion is relatively small in area, at just one end, and I would like to have the whole thing etched. I will not hold you to the preliminary estimate because this may cause you a bit more work. I think I recall that when Mr. Wininger originally etched it for me here we first covered the olivine and chromite portions with lacquer for protection from the acids, and I presume you have some similar technique now.

You might have to do some more polishing or even fine grinding than normally because of one area where some one to whom I lent the piece for display tried to remove some rust, apparently with a fine abrasive of some sort.

Just go ahead with this and ship it back by express collect when you finish. Please use my residence address as above. Many thanks.

Do you generally lacquer these or cover the etched are with some sort of protective layer after you finish? I would have no objection, and in fact think it advisable.
